

NCC acquired The Husavik Coastal Wetlands property in February of 2019. This property is approximately 52 acres (21 hectares) in size, and was a high priority for conservation in NCC's Interlake Natural Area Conservation Plan. The property is characterized by coastal Lake Winnipeg wetlands and islands which are dominated by cattail, common reed, and willow. Coastal wetlands provide a crucial ecosystem service by controlling the flow of water and nutrients into Lake Winnipeg, making the securement of this property even more special.
