

# Weston Family Prairie Grasslands Initiative

## Stewardship Investment Program Application Form - 2024

#### **Program Background**

The Weston Family Prairie Grasslands Initiative – Stewardship Investment Program is a multi-year (2021-2024) collaboration to celebrate, steward and protect one of Canada's most ecologically valuable and threatened ecosystems: native prairie grasslands. The Nature Conservancy of Canada, together with Ducks Unlimited Canada, Manitoba Habitat Conservancy, Southern Alberta Land Trust Society and Western Sky Land Trust will work with their landowners and land managers to implement a Stewardship Investment Program to accelerate the adoption of sustainable approaches to protect and restore biodiversity in this unique landscape.










Canadian prairie grasslands are complex ecosystems that support critical biodiversity. These working landscapes provide habitat for hundreds of species, including migration stops for millions of birds. Grasslands provide food for Canadians by supporting soil health, offering grazing for livestock, and acting as habitat for pollinators. Native grasslands are resilient and play a key role in mitigating the effects of climate change, but once destroyed are difficult to restore. Through this program, we will work with local communities and grassland managers to increase the amount of land protection in the prairies, improve species at risk habitat, enable wildlife movement, and ultimately increase long- term ecological and economic stability.

### **Program Eligibility**

Landowners with an existing conservation agreement from a partnering land trust that protects intact native grasslands, renters of the Nature Conservancy of Canada fee simple land, and eligible community pastures and their patrons can apply for Stewardship Investment Program grants. The Nature Conservancy of Canada (NCC), Ducks Unlimited Canada (DUC), Manitoba Habitat Conservancy (MHC), Southern Alberta Land Trust Society (SALTS), and Western Sky Land Trust (WSLT) will work with Applicants to screen and prioritize projects according to the acres of land that can be improved, and the biodiversity and ecosystem enhancements that can be achieved through nine categories: 1) improve range utilization, 2) increase native range, 3) improve wildlife habitat, 4) support species at risk, 5) reduce fencing impact on wildlife movement, 6) improve water management, 7) manage weeds and invasive species, 8) educate grassland stewards, 9) reduce predator conflict.

Land Trusts will employ conservation prioritization tools to examine occurrences of species at risk, rare or endangered plant, bird or wildlife species when considering project approval. Lands must be located within the 14 priority ecoregions identified across Alberta, Saskatchewan, and Manitoba; projects may be ranked by the Land Trust to prioritize funding to projects with the highest biodiversity outcome rating.



Potential projects will be screened by Land Trusts to verify eligibility. Projects may require a site visit by land trust staff to determine project suitability. Applications may be submitted from January 3, 2024 to June 30, 2024. Land Trusts will submit projects to the NCC Weston Family Prairie Grassland Initiative (WFPGI) program staff (the Program) for final approval prior to implementation. Applicants will have until November 30, 2024 to complete projects, and final verification from the Applicant's Land Trust partner must be completed prior to the release of grant funds. Funding will be awarded for an average of \$10,000 per project. Project costs can exceed \$10,000, but partial funding may be awarded. Applicants are responsible for all costs beyond the agreed upon grant value.

#### **Examples of Projects**

Stewardship Investment projects may include such things as removing old fence, building wildlife friendly fence, installing remote water systems, conducting range health assessments, species surveys, weed control through herbicide or biological control and workshops or classes to support landowners that want to improve grassland stewardship. A comprehensive list of 36 separate projects follows in Appendix A.

Grant recipients of portable infrastructure, such as portable water systems or electric fencing, will use the equipment on the designated lands in the application for the length of the project (June 2021 - December 2024) to achieve lasting biodiversity results. These portable units shall not be sold or transferred without express permission from the Land Trust and NCC Program Director.

#### **Applicant (Landowner) Statement of Declaration**

- 1. I hereby apply to the Weston Family Prairie Grasslands Initiative Stewardship Investment Program (the "Program"), administered by the Nature Conservancy Canada (NCC) in partnership with \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ (Land Trust) for the funding requested in this application.
- 2. I declare that I am the Applicant or that I am authorized to sign on behalf of the Applicant. I agree that all references to "I", "me" and "my" in this Statement of Declaration shall be deemed to read the "Applicant", with the necessary grammatical changes required; and that by my signature and delivery of this application, including this Statement of Declaration, to the Program, I understand I will be legally bound by, and agree to adhere to the Program guidelines, including the terms set out below.
- 3. I declare that my project is as described in Appendix A.
- 4. I declare that:
  - a. the eligible project was not commenced before January 3, 2024;
  - b. any capital infrastructure purchased through the Program shall be utilized on the associated lands enrolled, as indicated on the application form for the duration of the agreement (ending December 31, 2024);
  - c. I will secure all necessary permits, licenses and regulatory approvals where required prior to commencing the project.
- 5. I agree that NCC and related agencies will in no way be liable for anything related to the construction of an approved project. Neither NCC, nor the associated Land Trust, shall be liable to me for any liabilities that I incur in the performance of the work undertaken by me in this project. I shall indemnify and hold NCC, the Land Trust, and employees, agents, and representatives, past or present, harmless from and against all claims, liabilities, losses, damages, costs, expenses and causes of action, including claims:
  - a. arising out of any breach or failure by me to perform any of my obligations under this Program;
  - b. relating to injury (including death) to persons or loss of or damage to property arising out of the implementation of the project by me or my contractors, officers, agents or employees; or
  - c. arising out of the work undertaken by me related to this project including, but not limited to, claims for builders' liens, workers' compensation, employment insurance, holidays, or other employment benefits.

- 6. I acknowledge and agree that I am not eligible for reimbursement unless and until 1) the Program has provided approval for the project(s), and 2) all necessary project completion verification documentation has been provided to the Program. I agree to inform the Land Trust as soon as practicable of any changes to my application information for the purpose of administering this application. I acknowledge and agree that any changes made to the project without the approval of the Program may not be reimbursed. Amounts reimbursed to applicant shall not exceed the budget for labour and custom work without prior approval by the Program.
- 7. I acknowledge and agree that eligible expenses may include costs such as capital costs for water systems, fencing, custom work such as for well drilling or fencing, and rental costs for machinery to complete projects. Ineligible costs include travel costs to pick up materials, or the purchase of tools to build or complete the projects. Applicants may elect to perform some of the custom work themselves and will be compensated at a rate approved by the Program, not to exceed \$30/hour for labour. Rates for machinery rental must be approved by the Program.
- 8. The following additional requirements are applicable where the applicant is a pasture patron or a grazing lease holder on NCC owned land.
  - a. I agree that the equipment and supplies purchased with program funding will be used to contribute to improving grassland and rangeland management;
  - b. I agree to maintain the equipment and supplies purchased with program funding in good and serviceable condition;
  - c. I agree to return the equipment and supplies to NCC if at any time prior to December 31, 2024 the equipment and supplies are not being used for the purposes of improved grassland and rangeland management;
  - d. Following completion of the Program on Dec 31, 2024, any equipment of portable nature, such as portable electric fencing or a portable solar system, will be owned by the applicant. Permanent equipment installed on the landscape remains the property of NCC.
- 9. I agree to provide information, including access to project records such as original receipts, proof of payments for costs claimed and photos of the completed eligible project, that the Program may reasonably require.
- 10. I declare and agree that to avoid duplication of reimbursement to be made pursuant to this application, no other claim has been made, or will be made to other programs, for the eligible expenditures that are the subject of this project, to programs administered under any other government grant, rebate or assistance program unless otherwise disclosed in this application.

- 11. I agree that all reporting to Canada Revenue Agency of income and expenses arising from the project through the Program are my responsibility.
- 12. I agree to provide upon request to Land Trust and/or NCC: information about me or my project, which will be collected for the purposes of:
  - i. verifying and processing the application;
  - ii. determining my eligibility for the Program;
  - iii. verifying that regulatory requirements have been addressed;
  - iv. verifying project completion and eligibility for reimbursement:
  - v. research and statistical analysis of program outcomes as they relate to biodiversity outcomes.
- 13. I agree that random audits may be performed, and I agree to cooperate with NCC and Land Trusts in the completion of any audit, evaluation, or survey of the project or of the Program.
- 14. I agree that NCC, Land Trust or designated representatives are authorized to enter the properties identified on the application in order to conduct an inspection of the eligible project, when completed, that is subject of this application, up to the end of the project, December 31, 2024.
- 15. I declare that this application does not constitute a conflict of interest for the Landowner, Applicant, Land Trust staff or board members. I declare that NCC and my Land Trust representative have been notified of any personal relationships I hold with members of their organization or board which may be perceived as a conflict of interest.
- 16. I agree that payments to Applicants will not exceed the grant subtotal in the budget above and that any cost overruns or expenditures in excess of the grant amount will be the responsibility of the applicant. Financing, interest, legal fees, or taxes are not eligible for reimbursement.
- 17. The Land Trust reserves the right to terminate the Agreement if the Applicant fails to complete the project as described in Appendix A by November 30, 2024. In such event, the Land Trust is not liable to provide compensation for materials and/or labour to the Landowner for partial completion of the project and any advance payments will be reimbursed to the Land Trust.
- 18. I declare that the information included in this application is true and correct in every respect. I understand that the provision of false, misleading, or fraudulent information, or a failure to comply with the program guidelines may result in this application or future applications being denied, and any payments issued being declared an overpayment and must be repaid.
