**Snow goose**

The golden eagle is the world's most common official national bird, serving as an emblem in such countries as Albania, Germany, Austria, Mexico and Kazakhstan.

Large flocks of these birds congregate in the Fraser River Delta in BC during spring and fall migration, with half a million counted in one day.

This species gathers in large flocks before migration, with up to half a million flying together at once.
