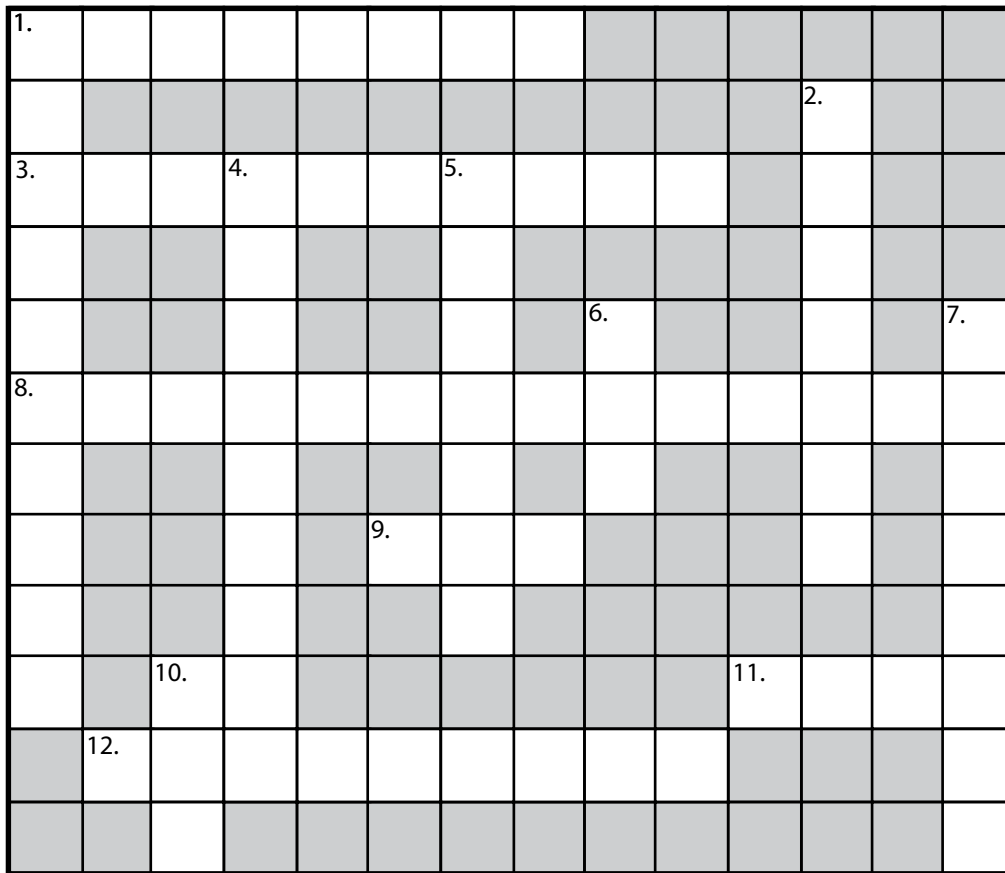


CONSERVATION CROSSWORD
